Bronco needs a home that will give him parameters and love him to life. With guidance (and he comes with a trainer) he will be that dog you are looking for. Plays like a maniac with toys and even fetches ... follows you everywhere and will prove you're a good cook! He eats like it's the first time he's seen food - blink, it's gone! Before training, he pulled on the leash and was easily distracted by buses and trucks on the street. He has learned how to be a gentleman on walks, takes treats "gently" and minds the rules you set for him!! If you scold him, he will give you side eye for a moment and wait to hear "ok, now good boy" and he's over it.

Bronco sits quietly while you work (or squeaking a toy to remind you he is there)! He does NOT have separation anxiety and gets along great with other dogs once introduced. To keep him healthy – Bronco really needs a 2 mile walk daily and exercised to get his playfulness in check!
